We've also upgraded our computer lab with four brand-new laptops—perfect for resume building, online training, and job searches. This exciting improvement was made possible thanks to the Delta Bingo and Gaming



Commission, whose continued support helps us provide the tools people need to move forward with confidence.

Toolbox Project

The season of giving is almost here, and the Toolbox Project is once again preparing to deliver care and comfort across Niagara. This year's goal is to assemble 1,500 holiday care kits, ready for distribution on December 11.

Starting October 30, collection bins will be set up across the region for community donations of essential care items. We're collecting travel-sized toiletries, warm socks, gloves, toques, and small comfort items like puzzle books, pens, and candy.

From Our Garden

As the growing season winds down, our garden continues to impress. Tomatoes and beans are still thriving, and we've begun harvesting Butternut, Honeynut, and Crooked Neck squash—along with apples, plums, and carrots from our friends at the Vineland Research and Innovation Centre. So far, we've harvested and distributed over 32,000 pounds (14,500 kg) of fresh produce throughout the Niagara Region.

In the coming weeks, we'll harvest the last of our watermelons, squash, potatoes, tomatoes, peppers, beans, and apples—aiming to meet or even exceed last year's record of 42,000 pounds (19,000 kg). The demand for fresh, healthy food continues to grow, and we're proud to play a part in meeting that need.

Bike Me Up

Bike Me Up Niagara recently joined the fun at the Queenston Harvest Fest, where we auctioned off a free bike and met many new faces in the community. Our new repair service has been a great success—this summer alone, we completed 28 tune-ups!
